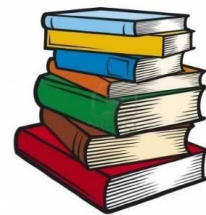




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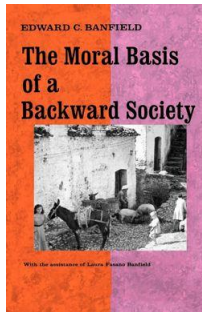

The Moral Basis of a Backward Society



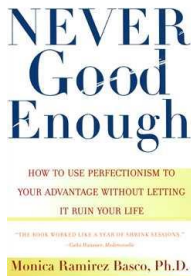
In post-World War II Italy, political scientist Edward C. Banfield visited an Italian town in 1955 which he called Montegrano. There, he observed a self-interested, family centric society that put the immediate family needs over the public good.

Banfield witnessed what was to become known as the “mafia.” He argued that the backwardness of the town was at least partially due to the villagers’ inability to act for their common good. He further concluded that Montegrano’s plight was rooted in the distrust, envy and suspicion among the villagers. Village life was more of a battleground than a community where all shared in the success of the village. As a result, there was an inability for the villagers to work together to solve common social problems, build an infrastructure, and address common economic concerns. Lack of a community is an important limiting factor in economic development, self-government by the citizens of the village, and a detriment to the public good.

James P. Carse argues that there are at least two kinds of games – one is finite; the other infinite.

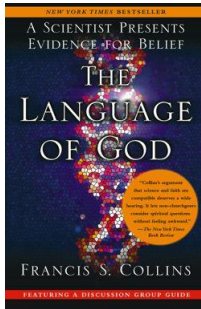

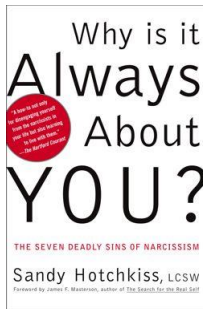


Considered one of the most influential American sociologist of the 20th century, Ernest Goffman's uses public behavior in this book as a means to define his concept of gatherings and to show their importance in contributing to society and to how individuals are treated. He draws distinctions between several types of public gatherings (social occasions, situations) and types of audiences (acquainted versus strangers).

In diagnosing mental disorder, psychiatrists typically cite aspects of the patient's behavior that are inappropriate in the situation. Dr. Goffman instead makes the distinction between acts that are approved and acts that are felt to be improper in society. He explains the social norms that surround an action – those expectations and what is considered "normal" behavior which other people interpret and judge the individual's conduct. The book provides detailed observations of behavior -- body language or embarrassment during a conversation – and goes on to process this behavior in terms of what is acceptable in social settings.

The Intelligent Design movement was born when a handful of scientists realized that nature exhibits characteristics that could not have evolved by random mutation. Michael Behe was at the forefront of this discovery and wrote about it in the first edition of the book published in 1996. Since then, *Darwin's Black Box* has established itself as the key text in the Intelligent Design movement—the one argument that must be addressed in order to determine whether Darwinian evolution is sufficient to explain life as we know it, or not.

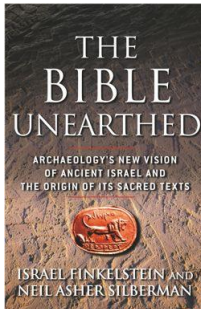

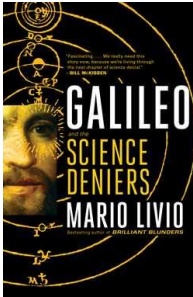
The Equation That Couldn't Be Solved describes the centuries-old quest that led to the mathematical explanation behind symmetry and order in the natural world.

What do Bach's compositions, Rubik's Cube, the way we choose our mates, and the physics of subatomic particles have in common? All are governed by the laws of symmetry, which elegantly unify scientific and artistic principles. Yet the mathematical language of symmetry—known as group theory—did not emerge from the study of symmetry at all, but from an equation that couldn't be solved.

For thousands of years mathematicians solved progressively more difficult algebraic equations, until they encountered the quintic equation, which resisted solution for three centuries. Carlos Castaneda

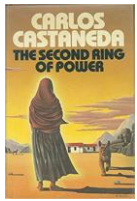
Carlos Castaneda was an author of a series of books that described his training in traditional Native American shamanism. He had a Ph.D. in anthropology when he met a Yaqui shaman named Don Juan Matus in 1960.

Castaneda's experiences with Don Juan inspired the works for which he is known. The books contain descriptions of paranormal or magical experiences, several psychological techniques, Toltec magic rituals, shamanism and experiences with psychoactive drugs (e.g. peyote). According to Castaneda, the most significant facts in a person's life are his possession of awareness and its impending termination at death. The primary goal of a Toltec "Warrior" is the continuation of his awareness after bodily death: to "dart past the Eagle and be free", in the words of the tradition, where the Eagle is the force which consumes the awareness of all living beings.

The books and Castaneda have been controversial for many years. Supporters claim the books are either true or at least valuable works of philosophy and descriptions of practices, which enable an increased awareness.

His 12 books have sold more than 8 million copies in 17 languages.

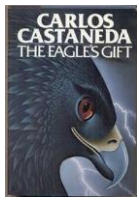

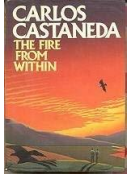

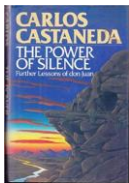
