Anne Curzan is a Professor of English at the University of Michigan and a collector of slang words, a dissector of colloquialisms and a charter of language evolution. Curzan has been published widely and has performed on live stages including TED, Smithsonian Talks, and her how segment on language on Michigan Public Radio. Her work has recently appeared in *The Washington Post*.

THE LAST ACTION HEROES opens in 1990, at the Cannes film festival, where Arnold Schwarzenegger, Sylvester Stallone, and Bruce Willis finally forged a truce. After years of bitter behind-the-scenes combat—Stallone once threw a flowerpot at Schwarzenegger's head; Schwarzenegger increased the body count in *Commando* to "have a bigger d*** than Rambo"—the world's three biggest action stars had finally formed a friendship.

Film journalist Nick de Semlyen charts their wild, carnage-packed journey from enmity to friendship. He also reveals the personal stories of the colorful characters who ascended in their wake, from Jean-Claude Van Damme and Steven Seagal to Chuck Norris and Jackie Chan. But as the '80s rolled on, the era of the invincible action hero who used muscle, martial arts, or the perfect weapon to save the day started to fade. When *Jurassic Park* trounced Schwarzenegger's *Last Action Hero* in 1993, all knew the macho men's glory days were officially over.

Drawing on candid interviews with the action stars themselves, plus their collaborators, friends, and foes, **THE LAST ACTION HEROES** is a no-holds-barred account of a period in Hollywood history when there were no limits to the mayhem that could be wrought—onscreen and off.

Nick de Semlyen is the editor of *Empire*, the world's biggest movie magazine, and the author of *WILD AND CRAZY GUYS* (Crown, 2019). As a film journalist, he has also written for *Rolling Stone*, *Stuff*, and *Time Out*. He lives in London.







by Charlotte Gill

Charlotte Gill’s father is Indian. Her mother is English. They meet in 1960’s London when the world is not quite ready for interracial love. Their union, a revolutionary act, results in a total meltdown of familial relations, a lot of immigration paperwork, and three children, all in varying shades of tan. Together they set off on a journey from the United Kingdom to Canada and to the United States in elusive pursuit of life, liberty, and happiness—a dream that eventually tears them apart.

ALMOST BROWN is an exploration of diasporic intermingling involving parents of two different races and their half-brown children as they experience the paradoxes and conundrums of life as it’s lived between race checkboxes. Eventually, her parents drift apart because they just aren’t compatible. But as she finds herself distancing from her father too—*why is she embarrassed to walk down the street with him and not her mom?*—she doesn’t know if it’s because of his personality or his race. As a mixed-race child, was this her own unconscious bias favoring one parent over the other in the racial tug-of-war that plagues our society? **ALMOST BROWN** looks for answers to questions shared by many mixed-race people: *What are you? What does it mean to be a person of color when the concept is a societal invention and really only applies halfway if you are half white? And how does your relationship with your parents change as you change and grow older?*

In a funny, turbulent, and ultimately heartwarming story, Gill examines the brilliant messiness of ancestry, “diversity,” and the idea of “race,” a historical concept that still informs our beliefs about ethnicity today.

Charlotte Gill is a bestselling and award-winning writer of fiction and narrative nonfiction. *LADYKILLER* (Thomas Allen), her first book, was the recipient of the Danuta Gleed Award for short fiction. *EATING DIRT* (D&M Publishers), a tree-planting memoir, was a #1 national bestseller in Canada. Her work has appeared in *Vogue* and *Hazlitt*. Gill teaches writing in the MFA program in creative nonfiction at the University of King’s College.
