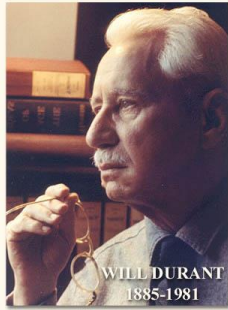


Will Durant Titles

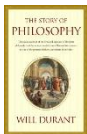


Will Durant was an American writer, historian, and philosopher who became best known for his work *The Story of Civilization*, 11 volumes written in collaboration with his wife, Ariel Durant, and published between 1935 and 1975.

One of the most gifted prose stylists of the 20th century, Will Durant viewed history not as a dreary succession of impersonal dates and reigns, but as taking place through human beings who loved, fought, dreamed and achieved.

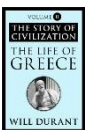
Their books have sold millions of copies. The Durants spent over fifty years researching and writing about human behavior in their critically acclaimed eleven-volume *The Story of Civilization*. His first book, *The Story of Philosophy* (1926), is credited as the work that launched Simon & Schuster as a major publishing force and that introduced more people to the subject of philosophy than any other book before or since.

***The Story of Civilization* in 11 volumes: -- Durant's most famous work and series – winner of the Pulitzer Prize**



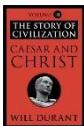
Vol 1: Our Oriental Heritage (1935)

A history of civilization in Egypt and the Near East to the Death of Alexander, and in India, China, and Japan from the beginning; with an introduction on the nature and foundations of civilization. This is the first volume of the classic Pulitzer Prize-winning series.



Vol. 2: The Life of Greece (1939)

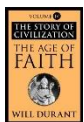
A history of Greek civilization from the beginnings, and of civilization in the Near East from the Death of Alexander to the Roman Conquest. This is the second volume of the classic Pulitzer Prize-winning series.



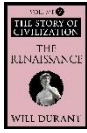
Vol. 3: Caesar and Christ (1944)

A history of Roman civilization and of Christianity from their beginnings to A.D. 325. This is the third volume of the classic, Pulitzer Prize-winning series.

Vol. 4: The Age of Faith (1950)

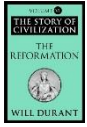


A history of medieval civilization—Christian, Islamic, and Judaic—from Constantine to Dante: A.D. 325-1300. This is the fourth volume of the classic, Pulitzer Prize-winning series.



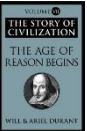
Vol. 5: The Renaissance (1953)

The Story of Civilization, Volume V: A history of civilization in Italy from 1304-1576. This is the fifth volume of the classic, Pulitzer Prize-winning series.



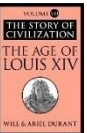
Vol. 6: The Reformation (1957)

A history of European civilization from Wyclif to Calvin: 1300-1564. This is the sixth volume of the classic, Pulitzer Prize-winning series.



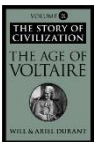
Vol. 7: The Age of Reason Begins (1961)

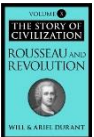
Vol. 8: The Age of Louis XIV (1963)

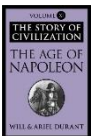
Vol. 9: The Age of Voltaire (1965)

A history of civilization in Western Europe from 1715 to 1756, with special emphasis on the conflict between religion and philosophy. This is the ninth volume of the classic, Pulitzer Prize-winning series.



Vol. 10: Rousseau and Revolution (1967)

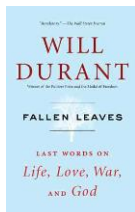
A history of civilization in France, England, and Germany from 1756, and in the rest of Europe from 1715 to 1789. This is the tenth volume of the classic, Pulitzer Prize-winning series.



Vol. 11: The Age of Napoleon (1975)

A history of European civilization from 1789 to 1815. This is the eleventh and final volume of the classic, Pulitzer Prize-winning series.

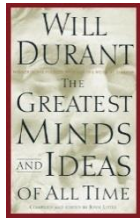
Fallen Leaves (2014)

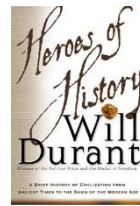
Greatest Minds and Ideas of All Time (2002)

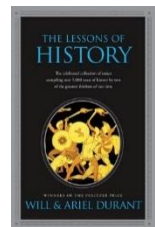
Heroes of History (2001)

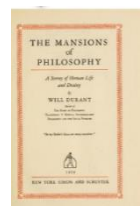
The Lessons of History (1968)

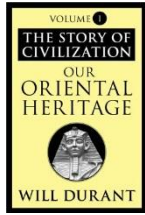
The Mansions of Philosophy (1929) (Revised 1953 under the title *The Pleasures of Philosophy*)



Following is groundbreaking book *The Story of Philosophy* comes Durant's survey of human life and destiny. Durant conceived of philosophy as total perspective, or, seeing things sub specie totius, a phrase inspired by Spinoza's sub specie aeternitatis. He sought to unify and humanize the great body of historical knowledge, which had grown voluminous and become fragmented into esoteric specialties, and to vitalize it for contemporary application.

The book seeks to make the personalities and systems of the major philosophers intelligible by transparent speech, and to vitalize them by contemporary application.
