


THE SADDEST GIRL ON THE BEACH By Heather Frese




BLOOD RUBIES



THE CAT WEARS A NOOSE: A Rachel Murdock Mystery By Dorothy Hitchens; Introduction by Otto Penzler

A drunken man is shot dead in this classic mystery starring the "observant and appealing" (PW) seventy-year-old sleuth. Hitchens pioneered the now-common "cat cozy" subgenre, writing her "Cat" series under the D.B. Olsen moniker; she is perhaps best remembered today for her novel Fools' Gold, adapted for film by Jean-Luc Goddard as "Band of Outsiders."

A speakeasy performer is murdered in this pioneering mystery from the mother of the police procedural. Reilly was one of the first women to write in the police procedural subgenre and she wrote over 30 novels starring Inspector Christopher McKee of the fictitious Manhattan Homicide Squad located at 240 Centre Streetwhich, before world-famous One Police Plaza, was indeed the headquarters of the New York City Police Department for 75 years.
