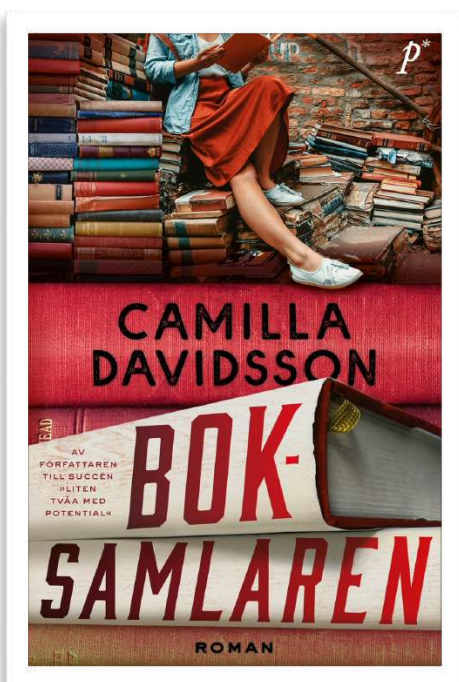
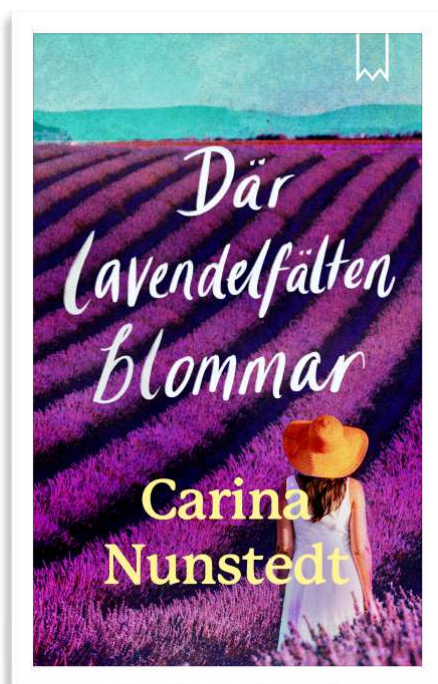

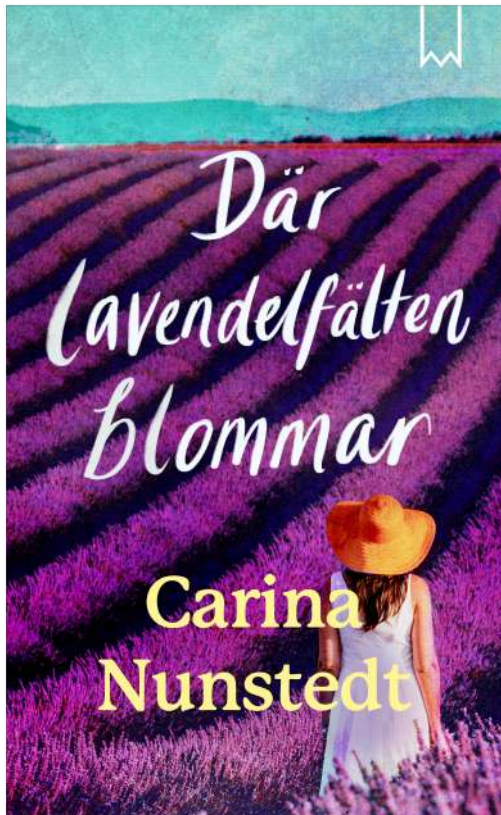

Part 1 - Just a Small Murder

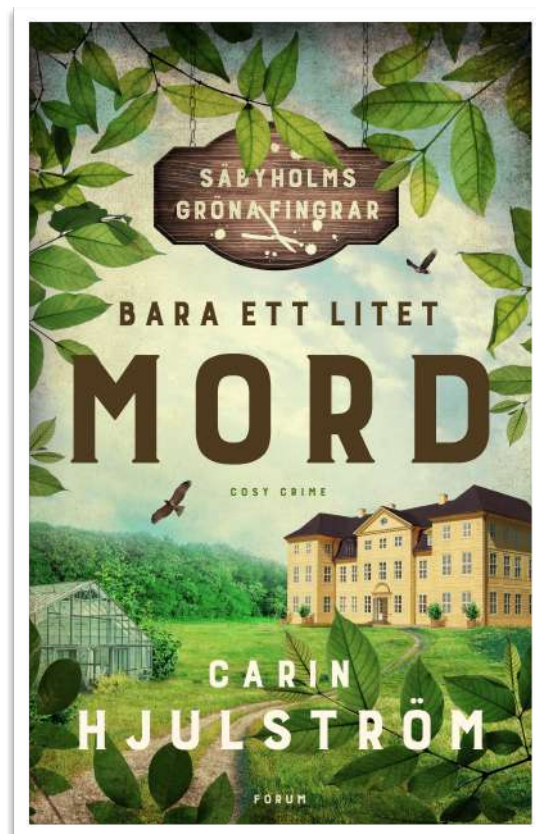

There she runs a plant school by the waters of Lake Mälaren with her nephew Anton - an orphan, former juvenile delinquent.

When an elderly man is found dead, probably murdered, in the cemetery next to his wife's grave, local police Olle Magnusson is involved in the case, and in the search for a murderer, he gets help from Siri. The deceased, the lawyer Isak Beyer, turns out to have had insight into unknown documents and events from the past that, to the annoyance of many, are now at risk of being revealed. **350 pages**

Part 3 - One Corpse too Much

In this standalone third part of the cozy crime series Säbyholm's green fingers, the area is hit by a strange disappearance. A thirty-year-old woman in military clothes passes the plant school just as the actress Siri Ehrensvärd picks up the newspaper and they exchange a few words. After that, the former elite soldier Maria Storm seems to go up in smoke and the police Olle Magnusson takes the help of Missing People to search through the forests at the same time as a wolf kills some sheep in the area.

Björn takes Anton and Cecilia with him to gallop horse competitions and after great drama, he buys, to Cecilia's great happiness, a difficult-to-handle stallion that would otherwise go to slaughter. Anton realizes that if he is to win Cecilia's love, he must overcome his fear of the unpredictable animals. And maybe if he wins, he could use the price money to take Cecilia on a trip with him to Kilimanjaro where his parents went missing. **420 pages**

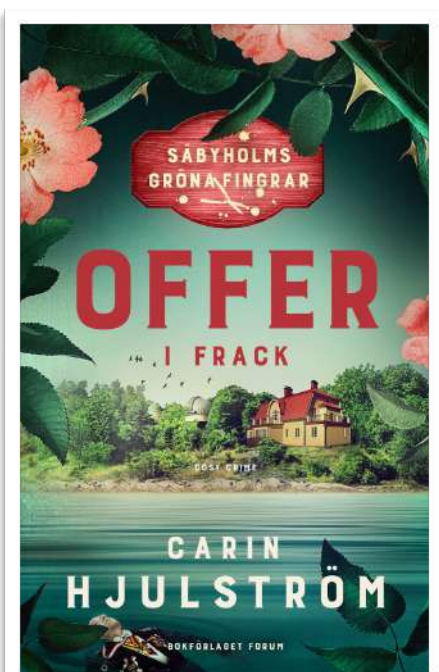

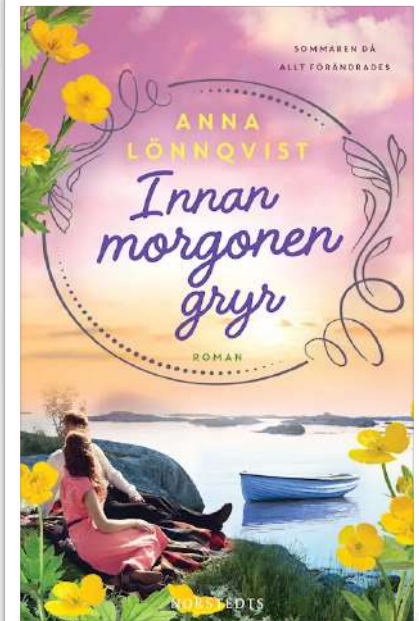
One Evening in June

Stockholm 2022: Céline Sarri struggles to find her direction in life. When she finds out that her grandmother, whom she has never met, is alive and wants contact, her life changes. Now she can get answers to the questions about her father that her mother never wanted to talk about. But Céline's search for her origins tears up old wounds in everyone involved. Tensions and buried family secrets from long ago send waves of waves all the way into the present. But can it be necessary to deal with the past once and for all? 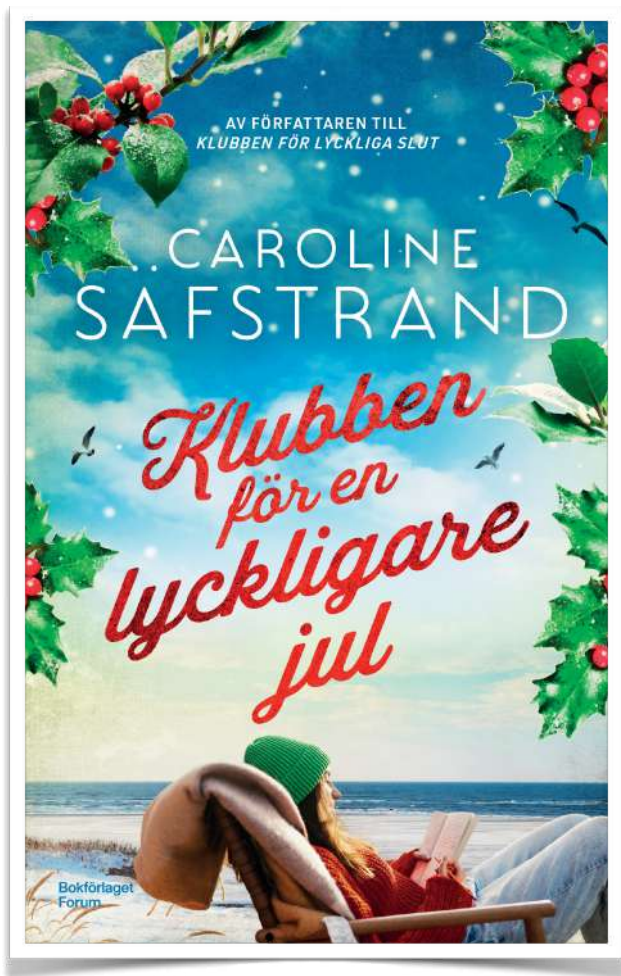

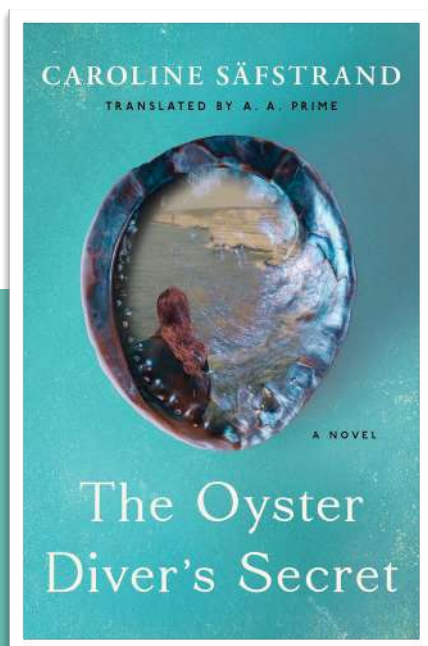

Martin's betrayal hits Helena deep, and once the school has closed for the summer, she flees the city for the mountains of Härjedalen, where she has borrowed a small red log cabin. In her solitude, life first becomes even darker, despite the endless summer nights. But then she meets the energetic Louise, who runs a waffle hut in the mountains, and Louise persuades Helena to find new joys in life. She starts working in the waffle hut and enjoys herself tremendously. But Helena carries a darkness from her childhood, which she must overcome to become whole again.

***The Seamstress' Dream of Freedom - part 2* (342 pages)**

Helena's life has taken a turn for the better, following her relocation to Härjedalen. Now, she's making waffles for a living, but she longs for more. This is when she notices the old yellow house where Hilda – the woman who previously ran the waffle hut – once lived. The discovery arouses curiosity about Hilda's life and person.

In the beginning of the 1970s, Hilda is living in an unhappy, childless marriage. The only thing that keeps her afloat is the waffle making and the guests she encounters, but deep inside she harbours a longing to sew. When a film crew from Stockholm suddenly shows up, Hilda suddenly finds herself at a crossroads, being offered work to make their costumes. But can she find the courage to follow her dreams and change her life forever?

Karin Härjegård is based in Jämtland, an alpine region on the border to Norway, where she lives with her husband, teenage daughter and dog. Here she works part time as a mountain priest. Karin writes captivating and warm relationship novels. She also enjoys writing both poetry and song lyrics.
